

崖柏属 - **Thuja**, Arbor Vitae (*Cupressaceae*)



北美香柏 - **occidentalis "Danica"**

Compact, round dwarf conifer that needs no pruning. Mid-green dense foliage, darker in winter. Thrives in all garden soils, tolerates chalky ones. One of the most useful dwarf conifers for rock gardens, pots and troughs.

occidentalis "Rheingold"

This conifer in early years has a rounded habit with fine twigs. When adult, becomes conical with more rigid branches. Golden yellow leaves from spring to autumn, in winter they turn a beautiful copper-red. Growing requirements: as previous variety. Use: on its own, in groups, for pots and troughs on terraces.

**occidentalis "Smaragd"
(*T. occidentalis* "Emeraude")**

Conifer which forms into a perfect cone without any empty spaces and a pointed tip. The leaves are a deeper green than any other conifer and remain unchanged even throughout the winter. Hardy, easily pruned, loves deep, moist but well drained soil. Planted singly, in groups, for hedging, in containers on balconies and patios.

occidentalis "Yellow Ribbon"

Narrow, regular, conical conifer. Scale-like leaves, soft to the touch, bright yellow from spring to autumn, attractive orangey-yellow in autumn-winter. Easy to grow, withstands full sun exposure.





**orientalis "Aurea Nana"
(T. orientalis "Compacta Aurea
Nana")**

Very compact, globular conifer which stays a regular round and compact shape even when adult. Golden yellow leaves, very vivid even in summer, reddish-brown in winter. Use: a free standing specimen in rock gardens or in troughs. Planted with other different coloured, dwarf conifers.

orientalis "Pyramidalis Aurea"

Perfectly columnar conifer with very dense foliage, without any gaps, very bright golden yellow in spring, tinged with bronze in winter.





北美乔柏 - *plicata* "Atrovirens"

Origin: USA. Conical conifer, pointed when young with main and secondary branches very dense and upright. Over time it keeps the conical shape but spreads out. Beautiful deep green, bright foliage, even in winter. Grows well in all types of soil, even calcareous, and tolerates severe, repeated pruning. Ideal for hedges.

plicata "Whipcord"

Highly original dwarf conifer with truly unusual appearance and foliage. Forms a sphere at first flattened, then higher, made of drooping, compact, stringlike leaves, dark green throughout the summer, bronzy in winter. Hardy, problem-free.
