

## Nandina (Berberidaceae)



## domestica

Origin: Asia. Evergreen shrub with look upright stems which Bamboo. The leaves are pinnate, compound and initially pale pink, becoming green in summer and tinged with reddish-purple in autumnwinter. Large panicles of pinkish-white flowers emerge from the leaves in summer, followed by clusters of bright red, shiny fruit in winter and spring. The best results occur when planted in moist but well-drained soil. Use: for beds, hedging, planted as a free standing specimen or with other

plants. Excellent plant for pots and containers as it is attractive at different stages throughout the year.

## domestica "Firepower"

Compact, dwarf, more branched than the type. Pale green, oval leaves, larger than N. domestica, turning orange-red in autumn. Excellent ground cover, also grows well in pots and troughs.
