

## **Trachelospermum** (Rhyncospermum) (Apocynaceae)



## jasminoides (Rhyncospermum jasminoides), Star Jasmine

Native to China and the sub tropical Himalayas, voluble, everareen, climbing plant with entire, lanceolate leaves, 4-6cm long, 2-3cm wide, very leathery, rich, bright green on the upper side, paler underneath which constitute extraordinary alone an ornamental feature. From the end of May to mid-July the plant is literally covered in thousands of simple, white, star-shaped flowers clustered terminal heads with a wonderful, penetrating scent that can be smelt

from a distance. It is not harmed by smut or pollution in cities and towns and if plenty of fertiliser is given it will grow tall and more vigorous every year. It can be used like all other climbing plants, that is, to cover walls, pergolas, porches, arches etc. It can also be used to hide anything ugly, to form screens when planted on trellises and fences.

## asiaticum "Tricolor"

Interesting variety, not so much for its insignificant flowers, as for stupendous evergreen foliage. On one plant at the same time are found green leaves with white marbling, red ones with green patches, all-over lilacpink ones, marbled pink with dark green patches. Used a great deal in Japan and in Florida for multi-colour ground cover. Hardier than Trachelospermum jasminoides.
